MONOCHROME MAGIC

This month, we've spotted a host of chic black-and-white rugs. Irish weaving expert Mourne Textiles has reissued its 1950s 'Milano' rug (top), created by company founder Gerd Hay-Edie for the Milan Triennale in 1951. The linen-and-wool design will be stocked by minimalist fashion designer Margaret Howell. Plus, London-based carpet store Woven Ground has partnered with Danish firm LD Selected to bring its on-trend geometric wool designs to life (centre). Finally, The Rug Company's collaboration with Alexander McQueen's estate includes the designer's contemporary twist on a classic ponyskin pattern (bottom).
